REMINDER TO PROVIDERS

- COVID-19 Test Orders must be submitted with an appropriate ICD-10 code for insurance billing.
- Coding and overall assignment of patient's diagnosis is the responsibility of the provider.
- Please include the following information on the test order: patient first and last names, date of service, date of birth, gender, patient address

KEY UPDATES

- The Health Resources & Service Administration (HRSA) COVID-19 Uninsured Program will no longer accept test claims after March 22, 2022.
- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Center for Health Statistics (CDC/NCHS) implemented additional ICD-10 codes for COVID-19 (published in CMS ICD-10-CD Official Guidelines for Coding and Reporting effective October 1, 2020). Code **Z20.822** is available for COVID-19 testing. This replaces Z20.828 effective January 1, 2021.
